## TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B) 23rd June 2024

First Reading: Job 3:1.8-11 Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

"Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him." Today's Gospel ends with these words. There are times when we recognize the mystery that surrounds our Lord.

In our life of faith sometimes we may have feelings of being close to God. Perhaps when we pray or worship or when we experience good times, happiness, love or joy. we glimpse the presence of God with us. At other times we might wonder about God's presence or even begin to forget the God we have known in the past. Sometimes life demands very much from us, especially in times of darkness, suffering and pain. At these times we can feel very isolated and alone. We may even fear we are going un-

The Gospel today reminds us that the God who is with us in good times is the same God who is with us in difficult times. God is always present, recognised or not!

After the Second World War, scratched on a wall in a bombed building, there was found a prayer that summarises today's Gospel message well. It's thought to have been written by a victim of the Holocaust.

The prayer is a prayer of recognition of a God present in all situation, no matter how difficult. It is a prayer about faith in a faithful God. It is a prayer for the desperate. Above all, it is a prayer of hope: "I believe in the sun even when it does not shine. I believe in love even when I cannot feel it. I believe in God even when he appears to be silent."

The story challenges us to trust in God's power especially when storms assail us. When you have faith you give up the need to be in control.
